

Report to the Brantford Municipal Airport Board

Airport activity

-With regards to the ongoing complaints from nearby residents about Helicopter traffic, AMCO has provided contact information for an Aviation Lawyer/Consultant, so that we can expedite the process of finding out which avenues are available to us. Anecdotally, on Friday Nov. 25, two of the inbound W. Ross Macdonald Bearskin flights had to break off their approaches and go around due to conflicts with the helicopters.

-We had our first snowfall and snow-clearing event. Clearing went smoothly, and it looks like the contractor has a larger fleet on-site than last year.

-Airport equipment has been winterized and is ready for the winter season. The only outstanding item is some minor repairs for the Runway Friction Measuring Equipment, which should be addressed this week.

-On Nov. 10th, Canada Customs initiated a Core Services Request Review, to consider expanding customs availability hours here at the airport from 9-5 to 8-5. If successful, this change could be integral to getting more corporate aircraft utilizing our airport.
