Building Safer Communities: Brantford's 2024-2026 Action Plan



Project Overview

The Building Safer Communities project is funded by the Government of Canada and is intended to support communities in addressing and preventing gun and gang violence among youth.

Youth-related gun and gang violence is not prevalent in Brantford, however this project provides an excellent opportunity to invest in Brantford's youth through prevention and awareness programs.

Working closely with community partners and youth-serving organizations, the Action Plan 2024-2026 address risk factors associated with gun and gang violence by increasing physical and psychological well-being, cultivating a sense of belonging, and introduce youth to positive relationships and experiences.

Developing the Plan

The Action Plan was developed in consultation with Brantford Police Services and Laurier's Centre for Research on Security Practices (CRSP), with input from a variety of stakeholders including youth-serving agencies from various sectors including, education, justice, and health and community services.

Moving forward, the City will continue to seek out and collaborate with stakeholders in the development of projects, programs and awareness campaigns.

Action Plan 2024-2026

Focus Area #1: Youth at Risk of Gun and Gang Involvement

Actions within this Focus Area are intended to identify and support youth that may be at greater risk of gun and gang involvement. This will include programs to support mental health and well-being, expand social development, and enhance youth connection to services and community resources.
