- 8. **Economic Growth and Community Empowerment:** Job creation, skills development, and entrepreneurship opportunities, fostering economic growth and self-determination within the community.
- 9. **Community Spaces and Infrastructure:** Multi-purpose community spaces for arts, cultural events, and gatherings, providing accessible infrastructure for community use and engagement.
- Environmental Stewardship: Commitment to sustainable practices and the protection of Mother Earth, incorporating eco-friendly design elements and promoting environmental education and advocacy.

The establishment of this cultural centre is not only a testament to our commitment to preserving and celebrating our Hodinosho:ni culture but also a strategic investment in the well-being and prosperity of Six Nations of the Grand River and the surrounding communities.
